This TIDE edition completes my first year as Commodore. The last 12 months have been eventful, and I believe pretty good ones for the Club. We have been able to sustain and improve the Club while facing imminent relocation and a persistent pandemic. I have to say I'm proud of the way our Club has risen to the challenges.

## Club Management

I would like to express my appreciation for the effort the Management Committee has put into guiding the Club in 2021/2022. I especially want to thank two of the more hard-working members, Peter Hawker – Treasurer, and Dave Harnett – Secretary, who are stepping back from their roles to give others a go. The activity Sections have nominated new Rear Commodores, and I would like to give thanks to their Section leaders taking a break:

Terry O'Grady – Sailing

As part of the effort to protect the Club's future, the 2022/2023 Committee will address:

- Membership Capacity - the Committee will continue to review membership numbers each month to ensure the enjoyment of the Club by members is not impeded by overcrowding.
- By-Laws – The Management Committee has the responsibility for the Club's By-laws, and is in the process of updating them. The intention is to have a draft ready for the members in the coming months.

- Club Constitution – The Club's Constitution needs an overhaul, and to that end, the Committee will draft a revised Constitution for members' review at the Half-Yearly General Meeting in February.

## Club Operations

Our General Manager Fenn McDonnell has completed his first year, and I'd like to acknowledge his efforts to date. He and our Staff have maintained and even improved all areas of Club operations, including the office, bar, galley and functions. Balancing the wants and needs of a diverse membership seeking to enjoy our little Club in their own way will always present a challenge, and I would like to thank both the Members and Staff for their efforts and patience in making it work.

## Club Relocation

The latest update from Development WA regarding the timeline for the project indicates they intend to complete the breakwater by the end of the year and commence dredging and seawall construction immediately after. Land clearing adjacent to the Club will begin in September and will continue into next year. Construction of the new club facility is scheduled to commence in the second quarter of 2023, with a 14-month build duration. Negotiations with the City of Joondalup regarding our future tenancy agreement have been initiated, and we're hoping to have a recommendation to present to the members in time for the Half-Yearly General Meeting in February. The response from the members to the invitation to participate in the relocation working groups has been very positive, and we will keep members apprised of the results of their work.

Finally, my personal thanks to all our volunteers for their selfless and under-appreciated help. They're usually in the background, dedicating their time to getting things done for their Club. As an organization primarily run by volunteers, any success we have enjoyed is in large measure due to their efforts.

### July Beach Fishing Comp

With another monthly comp falling in the middle of winter it was a nice to see the numbers almost double this comp with 10 anglers weighing in. The weather for the weekend actually ended up fairly nice. Low winds and sunshine for most of the Saturday meant for comfortable fishing conditions. My plans for a snapper on the drone went pear-shaped shortly after my drone took flight, as the connection with the controller was lost...sending it spiralling into the surf. I managed to pull it back in but it was probably the last time she'll fly. All was forgotten after a few pints and an early dinner with mr mulloway himself at the pub.

Mark, Nicole, Doug, Chris & Maree all headed south in hope for some Salmon and a few other south coast species. Maree got herself a Wrasse which gained her second place. Maree also hooked a MONSTER Octopus and after telling everyone at the club she released it, wasn't too popular! I'm not a massive fan of eating Octopus, but I tell ya the only man that's cooked it that I've really enjoyed, was Doug Rasmussen's pickled occy. Absolutely delicious!

Nicole Fraser ended up winning the ladies with 2 species, a herring & wrasse of 470 grams. Nicole ended up with 35 points, she also managed to get a squid off the Busso jetty, Great work! That's a couple of weeks in a row now Nicole has been victorious.

In his bag, he had only the one heaviest which was a 105g whiting. Ricko also got a decent skippy of 495g & Tailor of 630g.

John Lebeter ended up winning overall, with 6 species also but 4 heaviest. John ended up with 94 points including a Tailor of 656g, Tarwhine of 454g & a lovely Skippy of 763g. Nicely done Pommy! John's luck didn't end there with him winning the mystery fish which was the Tailor! \$110 was in the envelope which I'm sure he'll shout us all a beer at the next weigh in... NOT!!! Aha!

We only have 2 more comps until the start of the 22/23 season.

### August Beach Fishing Comp

With the annual beach fishing competition for the 21/22 season nearing the end, it's going to be a close finish with Pommy John, Ricko and Kiwi leading the pack.

The weather for this month's competition was fairly good, especially considering the horrendous weather Perth has faced in the past 3 weeks. Apart from being a very chilly weekend, it was perfect. In the mini juniors, we had 2 kids weigh in with Kaia & Crew both catching a wrasse each, with crew winning with the heaviest (468g to 322g). John had the biggest Tailor(763g) & Skippy(560g) of the day. There was a funny incident at the end of the awards with the lucky competitor prize randomly selecting Doug Fox. The joy was short lived as Doug was ineligible

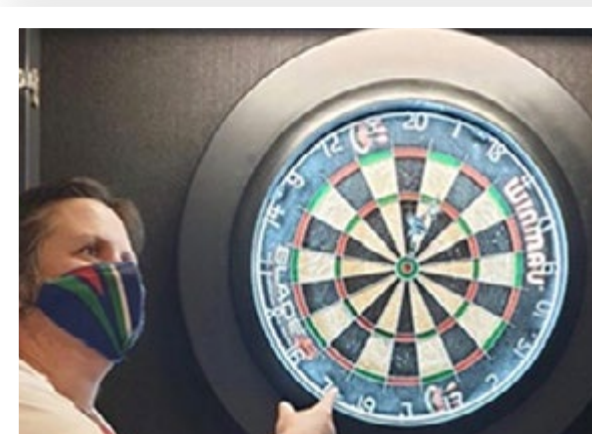
It has been great to see some of the C-grade players stepping up to help out our B-grade team who were short on numbers.

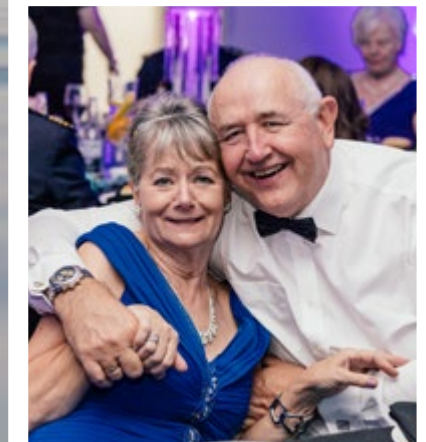
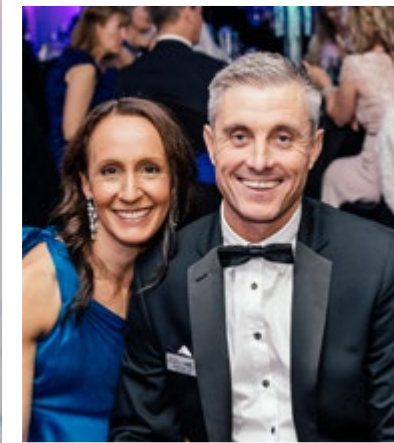

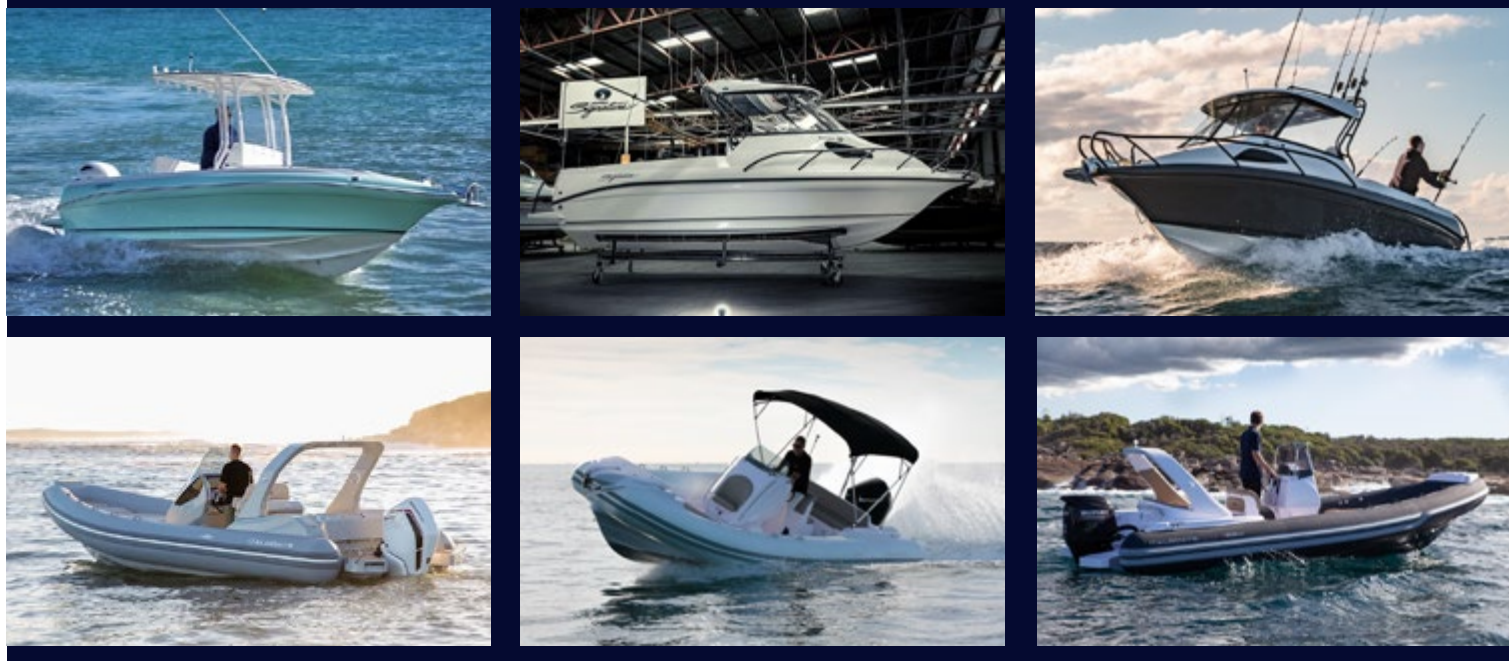
